**We are recruiting a Casual Suicide Intervention Clinician for a position on the Youth Services Program.**

This on-call position is dependent on available funding and plays a critical role in providing immediate, compassionate support to youth at risk of suicide, as well as to survivors and their families.

The Clinician delivers client-focused, trauma-informed counselling and leads suicide intervention initiatives including individual, family, and group therapy sessions. The role also involves facilitating community-based workshops to promote suicide prevention, resilience, and mental wellness among youth.

**KEY RESPONSIBILITIES:**

- Provide direct, client-centered counselling services through both referrals and self-referrals.
- Deliver individual, family, and group therapy aligned with collaborative service and safety plans.
- Conduct comprehensive intake assessments and suicide risk evaluations.
- Maintain accurate and timely documentation, including case notes and clinical reports.
- Address clients' concerns with empathy, professionalism, and responsiveness.
- Collaborate with internal staff and external partners through meetings and coordinated care planning.
- Contribute to community development efforts through outreach and education.

**QUALIFICATIONS:**

- Master's degree in clinical psychology
- Minimum of 3 years' experience working with high-risk youth populations.
- Strong knowledge of **suicidology**, crisis intervention, and trauma-informed care.
- Demonstrated experience working with vulnerable and marginalized populations.
- Valid Class 5 Driver's License, or currently in the process of obtaining one
- Exceptional communication, interpersonal, and conflict-resolution skills.
- Proven ability to work effectively and sensitively with diverse communities, including those impacted by mental health challenges, systemic inequity, and trauma.
