
EFry Superstar: Meet Rosie

A few years earlier, Rosie built a reputation as the woman who saves lives on Surrey's 135A Street, the epicentre of the opioid and homelessness crisis in the city. On a daily basis, Rosie administered naloxone to overdose victims bringing them back to life.

"I did what I had to do to save lives because I was there, too," said Rosie. "10 years ago, I was in the Downtown Eastside, bitten up by bed bugs. Helping people on the Surrey Strip and doing what I do now with EFry is a way for me to give back to the community."

Today, Rosie works as a Peer Support Specialist at EFry where she supports clients in building brighter futures for themselves. Recently, Rosie worked with multiple clients from a tent city in Surrey to get housing.

"I'm here to build rapport with clients, to advocate for clients, and to support clients in building a better quality of life for themselves and their children," said Rosie. "Healing trauma is a hard job. I was able to get through that and now I can support clients in their journey of healing and resiliency."


