ABOUT OUR PROGRAM



EFry's Sequoia at Firth Residences Substance Use Treatment Program in Abbotsford provides treatment for adult women (LGBTQ+2S trans non-binary) (19+ yrs) with substance use dependency, who may have co-occurring mental health needs.

Our evidence-based program promotes the strengths of each person. We provide a welcoming trauma-informed, culturally safe space. EFry's Sequoia Treatment Program supports individuals with their substance use goals.

Staff include counsellors, nurses, support workers, and cooks, with access to medical staff and other EFry programs.

STABILIZATION

Individuals are welcomed to the program and supported in stabilization for up to two weeks.

STAGE

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INTENSIVE PROGRAMMING

- Programming includes:
- Individual counselling
- Group programming addressing substance use
- Wellness supports
- Cultural supports
- Medical & mental
 healthcare
- Recreational activities

TRANSITIONING HOME

Designed to equip individuals to return home, this stage includes:

- Maintain and expanding a support network
- Relapse prevention
- Wellness supports
- Practical needs assistance
- eq. housing, education, training
- Aftercare planning

EFry recognizes that individuals require supports that meet their specific needs including:

- Holistic wellness focusing on mental and physical wellness
- Social connection
- Healthy lifestyle choices
- Resources in their home community
- Professional support 24/7
- Peer support through SMART Recovery



A referral for this program must be made with the client through a professional person in the community (counsellor, social worker, physician, psychiatrist, mental health or addiction team provider).
