Sequoia at Firth Residence Program



About the Program

Sequoia at Firth Residence is a Provincial Specialized Adult Substance Use Treatment Program for adults who self-identify as women, aged 19 years or older, who have a severe and high-risk substance use disorder and may also have mild to moderate stabilized mental health issues.

Our evidence-based **90-day program** focuses on promoting each individual's strengths, helping them identify goals that support wellness across various areas of life. Services are designed for individuals who have experienced multiple relapses and whose substance use and addiction treatment needs exceed the support available through their local community health resources or health authority.



Tailored Support

EFry recognizes that individuals require supports tailored to meet their specific needs, including:

- Holistic wellness focusing on mental and physical wellness
- Circle of support including loved ones, community members, and professional supports
- Peer support through SMART Recovery
- Resources in their home community
- Healthy lifestyle choices
- Social connection

Referrals

Referrals can be completed with the individual and in partnership with their community care team and applicable **Regional Health Authority Liaison**.

Program Stages

Stage 1

Stabilization

Individuals are welcomed into the program and supported as they settle into program routines.

Stage 2

Intensive Programming

- · Individual counselling
- Group programming addressing substance use
- Wellness supports
- · Cultural supports
- · Medical and mental health care
- Recreational activities

Stage 3

Transitioning Home

Designed to equip individuals to return home, this stage includes:

- Maintaining and expanding a support network
- Relapse prevention
- Wellness supports
- Practical needs assistance (eg. housing, education, training)
- Aftercare planning
